INVITATION TO A COUNTY LEVEL WORKSHOP FOR PREPARATION OF URBAN PLANS, URBAN DESIGNS, ECONOMIC/FINANCE AND IMPLEMENTATION STUDY FOR REDEVELOPMENT OF THE NAIROBI CENTRAL RAILWAY STATION AND ITS SURROUNDINGS

Pursuant to Articles on public participation in the Constitution of Kenya, The Physical Planning Act, The County Government Act and relevant provisions in Environmental Management and Co-ordination Act as well as the National Strategic Environmental Assessment guidelines, The Ministry of Transport, Infrastructure, Housing, Urban Development and Public Works in cooperation with the Kenya Railways and the Nairobi City County Government invites the general public to a workshop on 24th October 2018 from 8.00am at the Kenya School of Monetary Studies.

The project is aimed at developing an iconic multi-modal urban development dubbed the Nairobi Railway City. The project is situated within the area containing the Nairobi Central Railway Station, the marshalling yard, the Kenya Railways Pension Scheme Land (Muthurwa and Landimawe), the locomotive and wagons workshop, and extends beyond the Kenya Railways' land to include parts of the Industrial Area. The area which comprises about 368 acres of prime land is in urgent need of urban redevelopment to facilitate urban continuity into the Central Business District (CBD) and improve transport linkages to the South i.e. the Industrial Area. This is also one of the priority projects identified in the Nairobi Integrated Urban Development Plan (NIUPLAN) as a strategy for expansion of Nairobi's CBD.

To date, the participatory approach has been successful in development of options to inform the preparation of the Master Plan for multi-modal transportation, urban development, socio-economic development and environmental management. This public workshop is aimed at disclosure of the optimum development option and engaging members of public in order obtain their inputs.
