5. KIPPRA loaning its expertise in addressing the existing research gap in the real estate sector.

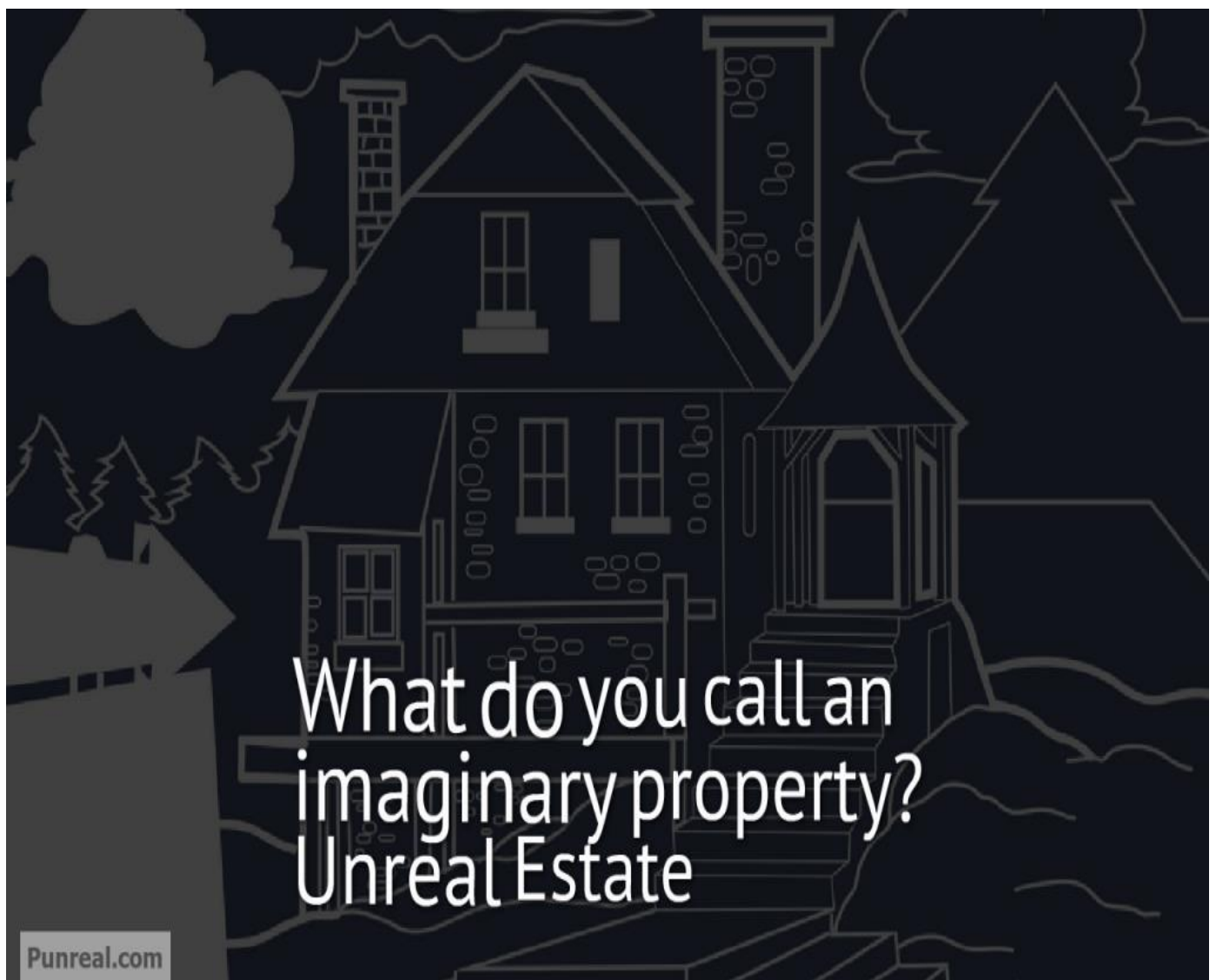

The Cabinet Secretary, Ministry of Lands & Physical Planning appointed a Taskforce on Electronic land transactions under the Land Registration Act 2012, the Land Act 2012 and the Community Land Act 2016 vide Gazette Notice No. 7859 Vol. CXX No. 90 dated 3rd August 2018. The Taskforce is mandated to study and review the Land Registration Act 2012 and the Land Registration (General) Regulations 2017 and land sector related laws with a view to formulate guidelines for electronic registration of land transactions and conveyancing systems then submit draft guidelines on the same within two months.
