One of our function include undertaking or commissioning research into any matter relating to the construction industry.

Towards this realization, NCA spearheaded a stakeholder-led process to prepare a research agenda for the construction industry dubbed the 'National Construction Research Agenda' (NaCRA) for the period 2014-2017. NaCRA is an NCA flagship road map, which identifies and prioritizes areas for research in the industry.
