



#### **CONCEPT PAPER**

#### LAND MANAGEMENT ISSUES

The Kenya National Land Policy (NLP) categorizes land into public, private which can either be freehold or leasehold tenure and finally, community land which is held, managed and used by a specific community. The management of land in Kenya has remained a contentious issue. This has led to problems such as environmental, social, economic and political which in turn results into tribal clashes, deterioration of land quality, urban squalor, under-utilization, tenure insecurity and conflict among others. This is further complicated by the absence of documented procedures in which land information, the management systems or the concerned people handling land information should conform to. There is also the case of overlapping institutional responsibilities, some degree of fragmentation of land use management authority and insufficient collaboration among the various landed professions despite the Land Act (2012) having a provision for regulating the service providers and professionals to ensure quality control. Decisions with regard to important land use and management are sometimes made outside the conventional management procedures. This is in order to accommodate investors or to satisfy the local demands from a particular person or interest groups.

A good land management system should enable the determination and delivery of information to users and this should include the effectual flow of information from the producer to the user and between the users. It is very important and crucial to develop documented procedures that will be used to coordinate the issues that lead to the inefficient land management.

**OBJECTIVE:** To come up with guidelines explaining the various Land transactions processes in Kenya.

What is the importance? The importance of coming up with the guidelines is to have a streamlined and single platform in form of a manual that guides land transaction processes within the country.

What will it resolve? The guidelines will bring sanity in the landed profession in that it will bring all the professions dealing with land matters to a defined workflow which is know and adhered by all. This will ensure effective service delivery.
