

COMPLIANCE TO THE SOLAR WATER HEATING REGULATIONS!!

The compliance deadline for facilities built before the gazettment of the regulations is 25th May 2017.

This is pursuant to the Solar Water Heating Regulations, 2012 Legal Notice No.43 of 25th May 2012 whose main objective is to promote the uptake and guide the incorporation of Solar Water Heating (SWH) systems in industrial, commercial and residential buildings.

THE ENERGY (SOLAR WATER HEATING) REGULATIONS 2012 LEGAL NOTICE NO. 43, 25TH MAY 2012

The Energy Regulatory Commission (the Commission) wishes to notify all owners and occupiers of domestic residential premises, educational and health institutions, laundries, restaurants, hotels ,hostels, lodges, restaurants, cafeterias and other similar facilities that the compliance deadline for all the above listed facilities built before the gazettement of the regulations is 25th May 2017

This is pursuant to the Solar water Heating Regulations, 2012 Legal Notice No. 43 of 25th May 2012 whose main objective is to promote the uptake and guide the incorporation of Solar Water Heating(SWH) systems in industrial, commercial and residential buildings.

Regulations among other things require that:

- All premises within the jurisdiction of local authorities with hot water requirements of a capacity exceeding one hundred litres per day shall install and use solar heating systems;
 Within a period of five years from the effective date of the Regulations, all existing premises with hot
- water requirements of a capacity exceeding one hundred litres per day shall install and use solar heating systems
- An owner of premises, Architect and an Engineer engaged in the design, construction, extension or geration of premises shall incorporate solar water heating systems in all new premises designs and extensions or alterations to existing premises;
 An electric power distributor or supplier shall not provide electricity supply to premises where a solar or the previous previous design of the previous supplier shall not provide electricity supply to premise where a solar
- water heating system has not been installed in accordance with the Regulations

The Commission will from May 2017 carry out surveillance visits on buildings under construction and random spot checks on premises built before the regulations to ensure compliance with the regulations.

person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these Regulations, prohibition or order of the Commission under any of these Regulations Commits an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding one million shillings, or to imprisonment for at term not exceeding one year, or both.

1. Who ensures compliance?

The County Government whilst providing approvals for building plans should ensure compliance of the Energy Regulations.

2. What is the fate of buildings that came up before the Regulations?

Buildings that were put up before 2012 and Buildings that have no provisions for the solar water heating in their plans are exempted from been penalized.

- Deadline for compliance is 25th May 2017. .
- Failure for developers to comply, the ERC will prosecute as a last resort. •
- Developers can apply for exemption from compliance to the regulations. • Instructions on how to go about the application for exemption are provided in the Act.
